Keitai toilets are sold at Visitor Centers, mountain supply stores, ropeway stations, and convenience stores near trailheads.

Keitai toilet means “Waste bag (WAG bag)”.

Some packages are labeled with “PORTABLE TOILET”, “DISPOSABLE TOILET BAG” or “O.D.TOILET KIT”.

There are limited toilet facilities in Daisetsuzan. Plus, the alpine zones are too delicate to support catholes as a solution.

Where toilets are not available, hikers should pack out their human waste. Use a *keitai* toilet, keep Daisetsuzan pristine.



Instructions



-  **1** Remove inner bag
-  **2** Set inner bag over the toilet seat, relieve yourself
-  **3** Close inner bag
-  **4** Place inner bag into airtight outerbag
-  **5** Dispose in a portable toilet bin after hike



Why are they necessary?

There are few toilets in the Daisetsuzan National Park. This has led to human waste being left at campsites and on hiking trails, and damage to alpine vegetation. These problems are yet to be resolved.
